

B1. Step-by-Step Guide: Determining the Major Access Route

The following steps are intended to systematically identify and document the major access route(s) in compliance with the specified requirements.

Step 1: Identify Key Facilities and Spaces

List all the essential spaces that need to be connected by the major access route(s):

- Main building entrance(s);
- Main lobby/ foyer;
- Lift lobbies;
- Clubhouse entrance;
- Shops, restaurants, cinemas, etc.;
- Toilets;
- External recreational facilities.

Step 2: Map Potential Circulation Paths

On the building plan, begin at the main entrance(s) and trace all possible circulation paths that connect to the required spaces listed above. Explore multiple potential routes. It is acceptable for circulation paths to pass through spaces when connecting from one entrance to another.

It is not required to identify a single access route connecting all the listed spaces.

If there are podium and/ or more than one building within the development, the access routes from the main entrance(s) of podium and each block/ tower should be considered.

Step 3: Assess Compliance of Each Route

Review each path to ensure it meets all accessibility requirements specified in the assessment criteria.

Step 4: Document the Major Access Route(s)

Prepare clear documentation, including:

- Annotated floor plans showing the selected route(s).
- Notes on how each criterion has been met.
